Transport

Following a question from a resident in Stokesley, Cllr Bryn Griffiths has provided the following update on electric charging points in Stokesley. Hambleton District Council (HDC) are installing 3 x 7kW units with a type 2 socket, in the Showfield Car Park which is run by HDC. The charging points in Stokesley are part of phase 2 of the installation plan which is in Summer/Autumn 2021.

Stokesley Town Council are currently exploring the options for locations and costs of charging points in the Town Centre. They are hoping to use expertise from HDC as guidance.

Zero carbon

At this time of year, we often look ahead to changes we might want to make. Here are some possible pledges to consider, in no particular order, based on idea from <u>Zero Carbon</u> <u>Harrogate</u>. Let us know if you make one or more of these or if you have made another pledge.

	Some pledges to help address the climate and nature emergencies	✓
1.	I pledge to ring my electricity supplier over the next 24 hours and see if they can switch me to green energy - if not I will find one who can.	
2.	I pledge to educate myself about the science and impacts of climate change.	
3.	I pledge to walk, cycle, use public transport to work or to make regular journeys at least one a week	
4.	I pledge to do a home energy check to find out how I can save energy at home. See the Energy Saving Trust website https://energysavingtrust.org.uk/ or call them on 0800 512 012.	
5.	I pledge to reduce my holiday air miles by 50%.	
6.	I pledge to buy local seasonal produce as much as possible starting with enough for at least two meals a week.	
7.	I pledge to contact my MP and my friends to ask them to make these pledges as well.	
8.	I pledge to work out my own carbon footprint using one of the many, easy to use carbon calculators such as www.footprint.wwf.org.uk	
9.	I pledge to turn my thermostat down or use a thermometer to achieve the lowest temperature that is comfortable and think about putting on a jumper	
10.	I pledge to use at least part of my garden for the benefit of wildlife.
